MORNING MESSAGE

"A No Name Prophet from a No Name Place"

Micah 1:1

- I. HIS MESSAGE WAS RECORDED (1:2; 3:1; 6:1)
 - A. Micah preached three sermons
 - 1. The coming retribution (chapters 1-2)
 - 2. The corrupt religion (chapters 3-5)
 - 3. The call to repentance (chapters 6-7)
- II. THE MESSAGE WAS REVIVING (1:1)
 - A. Micah prophesied during the reign of three kings
 - 1. The reign of Jotham (750-735 B.C.)
 - a. 2 Kings 15:34-35, "And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord: he did according to all that his father Uzziah had done. Howbeit the high places were not removed"
 - 2. The reign of Ahaz (742-716 B.C.)
 - a. 2 Kings 16:2-4, "and (he) did not that which was right in the sight of the Lord his God...but walked in the way of the kings of Israel, yea, and made his son to pass through the fire, according to the abominations of the heathen"
 - 3. The reign of Hezekiah (728-697 B.C.)
 - a. 2 Kings 18:2-7, "And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord...he removed the high places, and brake the images, and cut down the groves, and brake in pieces the brazen serpent that Moses made: for unto those days the children of Israel did burn incense to it...he trusted in the Lord God of Israel: so that after him was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor any that were before him"

III. HIS MESSAGE WAS REMEMBERED

- A. Micah was remembered three times in scripture
 - 1. He was remembered by Jeremiah
 - a. Jeremiah 26:16-19, "Then said the princes and all the people unto the priests and to the prophets; This man is not worthy to die: for he hath spoken to us in the name of the Lord our God. Then rose up certain of the elders of the land, and spake to all the assembly of the people, saying, Micah the Morashite prophesied in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah..."
 - 2. He was remembered by the chief priests and scribes

- a. Matthew 2:5-6, "In Bethlehem of Judea: for thus it is written by the prophet, And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel" (Micah 5:2)
- 3. He was remembered by Jesus
 - a. Matthew 10:36, "And a man's foes shall be they of his own household" (Micah 7:6)
