MORNING MESSAGE "God's Message to a Godless City" Nahum 1:1

INTRODUCTION

- A. There are two book in the Bible about Nineveh
 - a. Jonah 1:2, "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me"
 - b. Nahum 1:1, "The burden of Nineveh..."
- I. THE DECLARATION OF NINEVEH'S DESTRUCTION (1:1-15)
 - A. The declaration comes from God
 - 1. God's prophet (v.1)
 - 2. God's personality (vv.2-6)
 - 3. God's perception (vv.7-15)
- II. THE DESCRIPTION OF NINEVEH'S DESTRUCTION (2:1-13)
 - A. Nahum describes the destruction of Nineveh
 - 1. The collapse of Nineveh (vv.1-8)
 - 2. The capture of Nineveh (vv.9-13)
 - a. Numbers 32:23, "Be sure your sin will find you out"
- III. THE DEMAND OF NINEVEH'S DESTRUCTION (3:1-19)
 - A. Nineveh's sin demanded her destruction
 - 1. The failure of Nineveh (vv.1-7)
 - a. She was a violent city (vv.1-3)
 - b. She was a vulgar city (vv.4-7)
 - 2. The forgetfulness of Nineveh (vv.8-10)
 - 3. The fall of Nineveh (vv.11-19)
 - a. The military will fall (vv.12-14)
 - b. The merchants will fall (vv.15-16)
 - c. The mighty men will fall (vv.17-18)

- A. Only two books in the Bible that end with a question
 - 1. Jonah 4:11, "And should I not spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right hand and their left; and also much cattle?"
 - 2. Nahum 3:19, "for upon who hath not thy wickedness passed continually?"
- B. There are at least two lessons to learn from Nineveh
 - 1. One, if you repent of your sin you will be forgiven; learned from Jonah
 - 2. Two, if you refuse to repent of your sin you will be condemned; learned from Nahum
