MORNING MESSAGE "Did I Miss the Rapture?" 2 Thessalonians 2:1-2

- I. THE RAPTURE OF THE CHURCH (v.1)
 - A. This verse is an obvious reference to the rapture
 - 1. The word "rapture" means "to snatch away" or "to catch away"
 - 2. The word "church" means "an assembly"
 - B. The most thorough description of the rapture of the church is recorded in 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18
 - 1. The return of the Savior (v.16a)
 - 2. The resurrection of the sleeping (v.16b)
 - 3. The rapture of the saved (v.17a)
- II. THE RENOUNCING OF THE FAITH (v.3a)
 - A. This verse tells us there will be a falling away
 - 1. "Falling" translates the Greek word "apostasia" that gives us the English word "apostasy"
 - a. It means to defect from the truth, forsake the truth, or renounce the truth
 - B. Demas is mentioned three times in scripture
 - 1. Philemon 1:24, "Marcus, Aristarchus, Demas, Lucas, my fellow laborers"
 - 2. Colossians 4:14, "Luke, the beloved physician, and Demas, greet you"
 - 3. 2 Timothy 4:10, "For Demas hath forsaken me, having loved this present world"
- III. THE RISE OF THE ANTICHRIST (v.3b)
 - A. This verse introduces the Antichrist
 - 1. "Anti" means "against"
 - a. There are many anti-Christs today
 - B. This speaks of the Antichrist with a capital "A"
 - 1. Paul called him "that man of sin"; his main characteristic will be sin
 - 2. Paul called him "the son of perdition"; "perdition" means "destruction"; his goal will be to destroy everything that is related to God and His purposes
 - 3. John called him the "antichrist" in 1 John 2:18,22
 - 4. John called him "the beast" in Revelation 13
