"Mark – The Virtuous Life of Jesus"
Mark 15:1-15

## **INTRODUCTION**

- A. The Gospel according to Mark
  - 1. The author is a young man named John Mark
    - a. He is first mentioned in Acts 12:12
    - b. He was a traveling companion of Paul and Barnabas in Acts 12:25
    - c. He went back home to Jerusalem in Acts 13:13
    - d. He was the point of contention between Paul and Barnabas in Acts 15:36
    - e. He was profitable unto Paul in 2 Timothy 4:11
    - f. He was probably led to faith in Christ by Peter according to 1 Peter 5:13
  - 2. The audience of Mark was Gentiles; Romans
  - 3. The aim of Mark was to present Jesus as the suffering Servant
- B. My text focuses on the virtuous life of Jesus
  - 1. Hebrews 4:15 says He "was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin"
  - 2. 1 Peter 2:22 says He "did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth"
  - 3. The text compares Him to three groups: the priests, the politician, and the prisoner
    - a. The priests are introduced in verse 1, "And straightway in the morning the chief priests"
    - b. The politician is introduced in verse 1, "and delivered him unto Pilate"
    - c. The prisoner is introduced in verse 7, "And there was one name Barabbas"
- I. THE PRIESTS (v.1a)
  - A. The chief priests were the leaders of the Sanhedrin
    - 1. They are meeting "in the morning"
    - 2. They are meeting "to deliver him (Jesus) unto Pilate"
    - 3. They are meeting to make false accusations
  - B. Why do they want to kill Him?
    - 1. Because He was a threat to their power

- 2. Because He did not meet their expectations
- 3. Because He exposed their sin

## II. THE POLITICIAN (v.1b)

- A. The politician was a man named Pilate
- B. Pilate had three alternatives
  - 1. He could release Jesus
  - 2. He could rebuff Jesus
  - 3. He could return Jesus

## III. THE PRISONER (v.7)

- A. The prisoner was a man named Barabbas
  - 1. His name means "son of father"
- B. Every gospel writer mentions him
  - 1. Matthew 27:16 calls him "a notable prisoner"
  - 2. Luke 23:25 says he is guilty of "sedition"
  - 3. John 18:40 says he was a "robber"
  - 4. Mark 15:7 says he was guilty of "insurrection" and "murder"
